10 “Must Sees”

1 ~ Whispering Wall

Yettie Road, Williamstown
Open every day 8am to 5pm



The Whispering Wall is the retaining wall of Barossa Reservoir. Built between 1899 and 1903 it is a revolutionary engineering feat with unique acoustic effects. Words whispered at each side can be clearly heard more than 100 metres away.

4 ~ “Day Off, Peter”

Childrens Reserve, Angaston

A work by sculpture Christopher Radford for Angaston Agricultural Bureau’s centenary year in 1988. The fibreglass monument was restored in bronze in 2008.



2 ~ Mengler Hill and Barossa Sculpture Park

Mengler Hill Road, Tanunda



Overlook the valley floor of the Barossa and beyond (as far as the sea on a clear day) from the lookout. Take a stroll for a close up look at the sculpture works of artists from around the world.

5 ~ Luhrs Cottage

Light Pass Road, Light Pass
Open every day, gold coin donation



Built in 1848 as the home of the first Lutheran school teacher. Today the cottage, school room and cellar display historical items and samples of the children’s school work.

3 ~ Seppelt Mausoleum

Seppeltsfield Road, Seppeltsfield

Walk between the palms up the steep path to the private mausoleum of the Seppelt family.



6 ~ Herbig Tree

Angaston to Mt Pleasant Rd, Springton

Visit the gum tree which was the residence of Friedrich & Caroline Herbig and their first 2 children from 1858.



7 ~ Old Union Chapel
Penrice Road, Angaston

Built in 1844 as a multi-denominational place of worship by George Fife Angas, who was a dedicated believer in religious freedom. The oldest public building in the Barossa which has been restored by local volunteers for the community to use.



9 ~ Barossa Bushgardens
Penrice Road, Nuriootpa
(Entrance off Coulthard Reserve Track)
Open every day, anytime

A community project and a regional native flora centre. Over 100 Barossa flora species are showcased including display gardens.



8 ~ Kaiser Stuhl Conservation Park
Tanunda Creek Road
(off Mengler Hill Road)
Open every day, anytime



Stroll through the 390 ha park of local vegetation, gum trees, rocky outcrops and friendly kangaroos. Marked walking trail and information board.

10 ~ Barossa Regional Gallery
10 Basedow Road, Tanunda
Open Tuesday to Sunday 11 am - 4pm



Art exhibitions and collection, tapestry and fabric wall hangings. Home of restored 1875 Hill & Son Grand Organ.
