Members of the Asia-Pacific region will come from Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Malaysia, Philippines (2 Districts) and Taiwan.

I am also anticipating the following from Kiwanis International: Paul Palazzolo, International President; Sylvester Neal, International Vice President; Stan Soderstrom, CEO; Christina Hale, Director of Club Excellence & Growth – Europe & Asia Pacific, Teresa Chen, Area Director-Asia Pacific and Scott Smith, KI IT Manager.

The experience, education, exposure and bonding that was present at the training in Kuala Lumpur last year with the current team was excellent, and allowed us to commence this Kiwanis year with a real sense of a team effort.

The Kiwanis International Board are wishing to move to a US-outside rotating system: Two in North America then One Outside of North America. The ASIA Pacific area is recognised as a fast growing area for membership growth. Further the board is looking to hold a convention in the ASIA Pacific area (probably in 2014).

Vale Owen Donaghy



I and many others have known Owen only since he became a member of Kiwanis International back in 1986, when he joined the Reynella club after an invitation was extended to him by his good friend Graham Mould.

Owen served the Kiwanis club of Reynella in many capacities, including President and Secretary and also found time to serve division eight as Lt Governor (twice) as well as president of the Kiwanis bus service. Owen was also struck by the merits of Aktion clubs and was involved in the building of the south coast Aktion club.

It was around the mid 1990's that Owen along with partner Shirley and daughter Cheryl transferred to the Brighton club. Again Owen has served with distinction in the roles of President, Secretary, Treasurer and bulletin editor for many years and also served Division eight as Lt Governor for another two years. Owen often attended the Brighton busy beaver Aktion club events in continuance of his support for Aktion clubs.

Most recently Owen offered his services to the Kiwanis bus service in the capacity of secretary and also as charter secretary/treasurer for the Kiwanis club of bus service operators (SA). In both these roles he will be sadly missed and difficult to replace.

Owen was frequently observed at or near a bbq, either as chief cook (and quality control officer) or the keeper of the coin. Owen through his many contacts, often arranged for the soft drinks or the sausages, hamburgers, patties and other provisions the club sold.

Owen was a great believer in offering children an opportunity to excel or at least be allowed to have a go. With partner Shirley at his side, Owen has helped establish a number of terrific kids programs, most notably at the Hackham West Primary School and the Noarlunga Downs Primary School. Seeing a need this has been expanded to include the beginnings of a k-kids club as well as a breakfast club and community garden, to ensure children start the school day with a decent meal and understand the need for good nutrition.

Owen has been a member of Kiwanis international for just over 23 years and it would be hard to calculate the many thousands of volunteer hours he has graciously given in service either as a leader, a worker or as a mentor. Owen has received many honours from his clubs, division eight and the District of Australia including a George F Hixon award and a district Lt Governors award.

Introducing....

Lieutenant Governor— Division 1—Tony Gunn



Nearly 60 years ago, my mother christened me Anthony Lapsley Gunn, but why, I know not. She always called me Tony so that is that. I am the second of five, the sons and daughter of an architect and bank ledger operator. My first home was on Greenhill Rd, Parkside, then we moved to Wellington Sq, North Adelaide but our formative years were in Rose Park.

The following is important biographical information for South Australians. We were educated in North Adelaide and Rose Park Primary Schools and Adelaide Boys' High School. What else is important? My maternal grandfather was named after a lighthouse on Cape Willoughby, and my paternal grandfather was born and bred in Bendigo with both my middle name and my surname having long associations with that town.

The same grandfather was a champion rifle shot, so must have been the original pop gun.

I was the black sheep of the family, choosing engineering at Adelaide Uni, whereas my sister attended Flinders Uni and the other three the university of life. Of the five we have all enjoyed success in our chosen fields, chef, electrical engineer, clown, prawnfisherwoman (changing to Ghostnets in later years) and photographer (waiter, picture framer, coffee connoisseur and bean bag manufacturer).

At University I was president of the car club, vice president of the jazz club and committee member of the engineering society. For sport, I played baseball from primary school to university before learning that I could not throw, bat, or catch. A slow learner. My real passion was motor sport, having been a corner marshal for track racing, navigator for rallies and Confederation of Australian Motorsport Steward. As navigator, I even had some success at state level. Can read a map but still cannot drive

I left Adelaide as soon as I graduated, heading for the riches of the emerging mining empires in the Hamersley Ranges, but after two years was enticed to Bougainville to act as best man for my mate. Why fly a quarter of the way across the world for a day's event, so to make the most of it, continued to England for a six month working holiday that evolved into a 14 year epic journey. The rest is history. Met Pauline, moved to Hartlepool, then married Pauline in a registry office on a roundabout.

We then moved to South Korea, where Alex was born, back to Lancashire in England where Nicola emerged, like a budding rose.

And for those with naughty fingers, there were 5 years between the start and end of this sequence. We also worked in Canada, America, Hong Kong, South Korea for a second time and finally South Africa. This trekking required the construction of power stations, either coal, oil or nuclear powered, which may explain my glow. We returned to Australia in 1989 before most recently settling in Melbourne in 1993.

Service has always been with me, having been encouraged by my mother at an early age to get properly involved. Most of us start with cubs and scouts, I then moved to Rotoract at high school, various clubs and societies at University, but put career and family first until age 36 when I joined Round Table in South Africa. In the first year I was appointed the equivalent of Division Newsletter editor and served on the Board. I transferred to Apex in Adelaide until kicked out at the tender age of 40, then Treasurer on the Unley High School Council, President of the UHS Rowing Club, Secretary and President of MacRoberston's GHS Council and finally to Kiwanis. Pauline and I joined Port Phillip in 2003.

There is no end in sight. Alex married Wendy and gave us Harriet and soon, fingers crossed, another grandchild. Nicola follows her dream of acting and has written, produced and performed theatre works in Canada, America, Europe, New Zealand and Australia. There are many gaps in this biography, but the price of enlightenment will be a glass of red at the next Convention. See you in the Barossa.

Kiwanis International Names Stan Soderstrom Executive Director

INDIANAPOLIS – January 15, 2010 – The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees today named Stan D. Soderstrom Executive Director of Kiwanis and the Kiwanis International Foundation effective immediately. Kiwanis is a worldwide service organization in more than 70 nations. As Kiwanis' chief executive, Soderstrom is responsible for supporting the international board, and providing leadership and direction to staff and volunteers for the global organization of both adult and youth members totaling more than 600,000.

He will also work alongside Kiwanis Foundation executive leadership to provide grants to thousands of organizations worldwide aimed at making better the lives of children.

Soderstrom joined the Kiwanis staff in 1997, and recently held the positions of Interim Executive Director and Chief Impact Officer.

In his previous role, he focused on the successful growth and development of the Kiwanis' youth and adult leadership development programs around the world,

as well as strategic planning and board governance for Kiwanis International and its two youth organizations, Key Club International and Circle K International.

Stan also led the introduction and development of new membership-based service clubs for elementary school children and adults with disabilities. During that time, Kiwanis enjoyed a 75% increase in total paid membership of its youth and young adult clubs' membership. He completed undergraduate studies at Texas Tech University and graduate coursework at the University of Texas at Austin.
