Tours to Taste the Barossa

“Taste the Produce”

The German settlers in the Barossa were renowned for their skills in preserving the surplus of garden produce. Many of these recipes are still made today.

- Visits: 🚗 **Wiech's Barossa Valley Egg Noodles**, Tanunda ~ Egg noodles hand-made to an original recipe
- 🚗 **Zimmy's Produce**, Bethany ~ Makers of “Zimmie's Dill Gerkins” and a range of other products from their gardens.



- 🚗 **Maggie Beer's Farm Shop** ~ Taste the products and see a cooking demonstration with verjuice in the filming kitchen for “The Cook and the Chef”.
- 🚗 **Gully Gardens**, Angaston ~ In their first season just 5 years ago, Rick & Rosemary sold 200kg of dried fruit at their farm. The 2009 season will top 8 tonnes.

“Taste the Farms”

Barossa farm and local produce is brought to the barrel sheds of Vintners Wines early each Saturday morning to sell to the locals and visitors. Scan the view of the valley floor and take a closer look at the sculptures.

- Visits: 🚗 **Barossa Farmers Market** ~ stalls trading local produce. Includes a burger and coffee or juice for breakfast.



- 🚗 **Mengler Hill & Barossa Sculpture Park** ~

Take in the views of the valley floor from the scenic lookout and see the sculptures in granite by artists from around the world.

Time & Cost:

“Taste the Heritage”

Experience early Barossa housing, large and small, as well as a traditional school and chapel.

Visits: 🚗 **Old Union Chapel** ~ The oldest public building in the Barossa. Built in 1844 as a multi-denominational place of worship by George Fife Angas, who was a dedicated believer in religious freedom.



🚗 **Collingrove Homestead** ~ Constructed in 1856 by John Howard Angas. A homestead and garden of grand proportions.

🚗 **Luhrs Cottage, Light Pass** ~ Wander through the 1840's cottage, cellar and school room and see a variety of items and schoolwork from the early settlers' lives.

Time & Cost:

Saturday morning ~ 9:30am to 12:00pm ~ \$20

“Taste the Barrels”

Venture to the small village of Greenock to sample their brew, then visit two family owned small wineries.

Visits: 🚗 **Greenock Brewery** ~ boutique brewers of quality ales right in the village of Greenock.

🚗 **Langmeil Winery, Tanunda** ~ home of the 140 year old Shiraz Vine seen on the flyers. Today Langmeil still uses open fermenters and basket presses for over half its grapes, resulting in premium red wines.

🚗 **LiebichWein, Rowland Flat** ~ The Liebich family began growing grapes and making wines in 1919.
